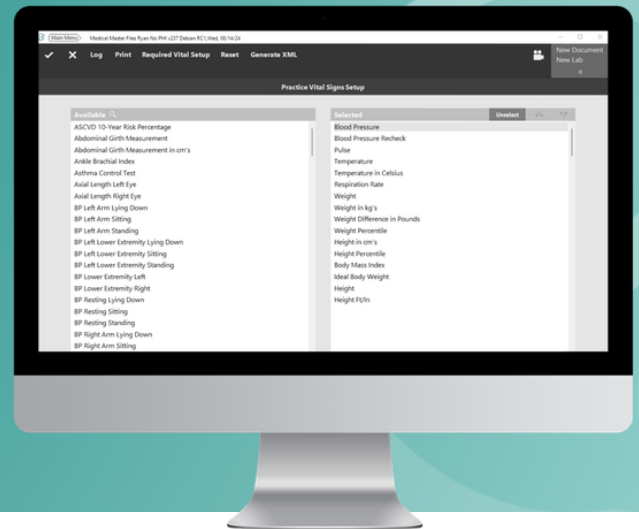


So you need to set up vital signs in medent.

What's next?

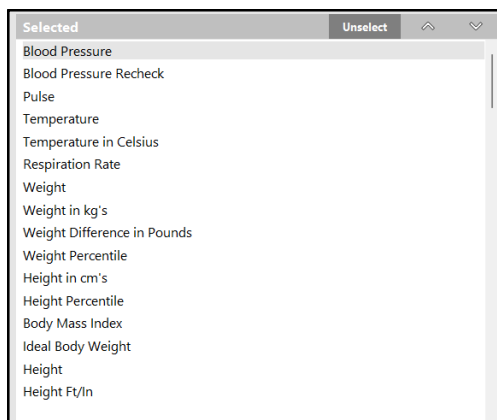
Consider all the different types of vital signs that are applicable for providers and specialties. Vital signs include examinations or clinical findings that a provider would want to graph and trend, such as Pain Levels, Body Measurements, Percentages and Differentials.



Vital Signs Setup

- Medical Records > Medical Records Setup > Vital Signs Setup > **Vital Signs**
- In the **Available** list on the left, double click to select items you wish to display in vital signs.
- In the **Selected** list on the right, click an item and click the **Move Up** or **Move Down** buttons to change the order.
 - You may also use the up and down arrows on your keyboard.
- When finished, click the checkmark in the upper left corner to save.

NOTE: Vital signs that are recorded will pull to the Progress Note for the day. Reference ranges and comments may be set for any of the selected vitals.

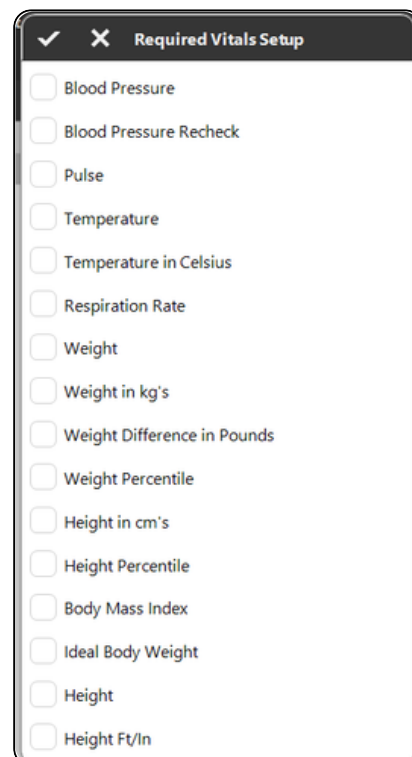


Required Vital Signs

A practice-wide setting designates specific vital signs to be documented. These are vital signs which should not be left unanswered. If the required vitals are not documented, the user will be prompted upon exiting the patient's vital sign detail screen to return and enter the required vitals.

Within the Practice Vital Signs Setup screen:

- Click **Required Vital Setup** at the top of the screen.
- Check the box next to the vital sign(s) your practice requires.
